The directors present their annual report and the audited financial statements of the company for the financial year ended 31st December 2020.

Lynn Canham held the position of company secretary for the duration of the financial year.

Principal activities

The principal activity of the company is staging educational theatre productions and drama workshops. Commissioning and producing educational theatre dealing with early years and youth centred issues.

There have been no significant changes in the company's activities during the financial year. The company has continued to improve performance in recent years.

Principal risks and uncertainties

Since March 2020 the spread of Covid -19 worldwide has been severe and has resulted in a significant worldwide slowdown in economic activity. In Ireland, the economic impact of this pandemic has been characterised by a series of prolonged temporary closures for many businesses in "non - essential" areas to ensure that people's movements are restricted in order to slow down the spread of the virus. The effect of Covid -19 presents many risk factors for the company, the effects of which cannot be fully quantified at the time of approving the financial statements. While the company has adapted new ways of operating over the last year, the directors still consider the implications of the Covid-19 pandemic to be a significant uncertainty at the time of approving the financial statements. Although the effects cannot be fully determined, the directors believe that the main risks associated with Covid-19 are as follows;

- an initial slow down in providing services during the period of lockdown
- a prolonged period of government recommendations and restrictions on the movement of people to contain the virus
- a potential reduction in economic activity following the recommencement of trading which may result in reduced consumer spending and demand for the company's services
- a reduction in asset values
- a decrease in the funding received from our governing body

Likely future developments

The directors are not expecting to make any significant changes in the nature of the business in the near future. At the time of approving the financial statements, the company is exposed to the effects of the Covid-19 pandemic which has had a negative effect on its operating activities since the year end and has resulted in obstacles in completing the services we provide. In planning its future activities, the directors will seek to develop the company's activities whilst managing the effects of the difficult trading period caused by this outbreak.

Dividends

The retained profit/ (loss) for the financial year amounted to €(21,216) (2019: €(12,380)) and this was transferred to reserves at the year end. The directors have not declared a dividend for the year.

Events after the Balance Sheet date

Since March 2020, the Covid-19 virus spread worldwide. In common with any other countries, the Irish government issued guidance and restrictions on the movement of people designed to slow the spread of this virus. Since March 2020, the Government have imposed a number of temporary prolonged closures of "non-essential" businesses. The company reacted to these conditions by closing it's offices with staff working from home. Whilst this has resulted in the company remaining operational during the period, there has been a reduction in operations as a result of Covid-19. The directors are confident that the company will be fully operational once the period of restriction is lifted.

Accounting records

The measures taken by the directors to secure compliance with the requirements of sections 281 to 285 of the Companies Act 2014 with regard to the keeping of accounting records are the implementation of necessary policies and procedures for recording transactions, the employment of competent accounting personnel with appropriate expertise and the provision of adequate resources to the financial function. The accounting records of the company are located at the registered office





Report on the audit of the financial statements

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Graffiti Theatre Company Limited By Guarantee (the 'company') for the financial year ended 31st December 2020 which comprise the profit and loss account, balance sheet and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies set out in note 1. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is applicable Irish law and Accounting Standards, including FRS 102 The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland, applying Section 1A of the Standard.



Notes to the financial statements Financial year ended 31/12/20

1. General information

The company is a private company limited by guarantee, registered in Ireland. The address of the registered office is Graffiti Theatre Company Limited by Guarantee, Assumption Convent Chapel, Assumption Road, Blackpool, Cork. The principal activity of the company is staging educational theatre productions and drama workshops. Commissioning and producing educational theatre dealing with early years and youth centred issues.. Its company registration number is 124759.

The charity has been granted charitable status under Section 207 and 208 of the Taxes Consolidation Act 1997, Charity no CHY 8810 and is regulated with the Charities Regulatory Authority.

2. Statement of compliance

These financial statements have been prepared in compliance with FRS 102 Section 1A, 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland'.

3. Accounting policies and measurement bases

Basis of preparation and going concern

The Financial Statements are prepared on the going concern basis, under the historical cost convention and comply with the financial reporting standards of the Financial Reporting Council including FRS 102 " The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" (FRS102) as adapted by Section 1A of FRS 102 and the Companies Act 2014.

The financial statements are prepared in Euro, which is the functional currency of the entity.

Since March 2020, The Covid-19 pandemic has spread initially from Asia to Europe and subsequently worldwide. The initial economic effect of this has been a worldwide slowdown in economic activity and the loss of jobs across many businesses. In Ireland there has been a number of restrictions placed on "non-essential" businesses which has resulted in many businesses temporarily closing in measures designed to restrict the movement of people and to slow down the spread of the virus.

Graffiti Theatre Company Limited By Guarantee has continued to work from home however productions and school activities have ceased as a result of the virus. The directors have prepared budgets for the upcoming 12 months which show that the company will continue as a going concern.

Turnover

Turnover is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable for goods supplied and services rendered, net of discounts and Value Added Tax.

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised when the significant risks and rewards of ownership have transferred to the buyer, usually on despatch of the goods; the amount of revenue can be measured reliably; it is probable that the associated economic benefits will flow to the entity and the costs incurred or to be incurred in respect of the transactions can be measured reliably.

Taxation

No charge to current or deferred taxation arises as the charity has been granted charitable status under Section 207 and 208 of the Taxes Consolidation Act 1997, Charity Number CHY 8810.

Operating leases

Lease payments are recognised as an expense over the lease term on a straight-line basis. The aggregate benefit of lease incentives is recognised as a reduction to expense over the lease term, on a straight-line basis.

Tangible assets

Tangible assets are initially recorded at cost, and are subsequently stated at cost less any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

Any tangible assets carried at revalued amounts are recorded at the fair value at the date of revaluation less any subsequent accumulated depreciation and subsequent accumulated impairment losses.

An increase in the carrying amount of an asset as a result of a revaluation, is recognised in other comprehensive income and accumulated in capital and reserves, except to the extent it reverses a revaluation decrease of the same asset previously recognised in profit or loss. A decrease in the carrying amount of an asset as a result of revaluation is recognised in other comprehensive income to the extent of any previously recognised revaluation increase accumulated in capital and reserves in respect of that asset. Where a revaluation decrease exceeds the accumulated revaluation gains accumulated in capital and reserves in respect of that asset, the excess shall be recognised in profit or loss.

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost or valuation of an asset, less its residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:

Long leasehold property	- 2%
Fittings fixtures and equipment	- 15%
Motor vehicles	- 20%

If there is an indication that there has been a significant change in depreciation rate, useful life or residual value of tangible assets, the depreciation is revised prospectively to reflect the new estimates.

Impairment

A review for indicators of impairment is carried out at each reporting date, with the recoverable amount being estimated where such indicators exist. Where the carrying value exceeds the recoverable amount, the asset is impaired accordingly. Prior impairments are also reviewed for possible reversal at each reporting date.

When it is not possible to estimate the recoverable amount of an individual asset, an estimate is made of the recoverable amount of the cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs. The cash-generating unit is the smallest identifiable group of assets that includes the asset and generates cash inflows that are largely independent of the cash inflows from other assets or groups of assets.

Government grants

Government grants are recognised at the fair value of the asset received or receivable. Grants are not recognised until there is reasonable assurance that the company will comply with the conditions attaching to them and the grants will be received.

Government grants are recognised using the accrual model and the performance model.

Under the accrual model, government grants relating to revenue are recognised on a systematic basis over the periods in which the company recognises the related costs for which the grant is intended to compensate. Grants that are receivable as compensation for expenses or losses already incurred or for the purpose of giving immediate financial support to the entity with no future related costs are recognised in income in the period in which it becomes receivable.

Grants relating to assets are recognised in income on a systematic basis over the expected useful life of the asset. Where part of a grant relating to an asset is deferred, it is recognised as deferred income and not deducted from the carrying amount of the asset.

Under the performance model, where the grant does not impose specified future performance-related conditions on the recipient, it is recognised in income when the grant proceeds are received or receivable. Where the grant does impose specified future performance-related conditions on the recipient, it is recognised in income only when the performance-related conditions have been met. Where grants received are prior to satisfying the revenue recognition criteria, they are recognised as a liability.

Defined contribution plans

Contributions to defined contribution plans are recognised as an expense in the period in which the related service is provided. Prepaid contributions are recognised as an asset to the extent that the prepayment will lead to a reduction in future payments or a cash refund.

When contributions are not expected to be settled wholly within 12 months of the end of the reporting date in which the employees render the related service, the liability is measured on a discounted present value basis. The unwinding of the discount is recognised in finance costs in profit or loss in the period in which it arises.

Trade and other debtors

Trade and other debtors including amounts owed from group companies are recognised initially at transaction price (including transaction costs) unless a financing arrangement exists in which case they are measured at the present value of future receipts discounted at a market rate. Subsequently these are measured at amortised cost less any provision for impairment. A provision for impairment of trade debtors is established when there is objective evidence that the company will not be able to collect all amounts due according to the original terms of receivables. The amount of the provision is the difference between the asset's carrying amount and the present value of estimated future cash flows, discounted at the effective rate. All movements in the level of the provision required are recognised in the profit and loss.

Cash at bank and on hand

Cash and at bank and on hand include cash on hand, demand deposits and other term highly liquid investments regardless of maturity. Bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings in current liabilities on the balance sheet.

Creditors and accruals

Creditors and accruals are classified as current liabilities if payment is due within one year or less. If not, they are presented as non-current liabilities. Trade payables are recognised initially at the transaction price and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

Cash flow statement exemption

The company has availed of the exemption contained in Section 1A of FRS 102 and as a result have elected not to prepare a cash flow statement.

4. Limited by guarantee

The company is limited by guarantee. The liability of the members limited.

Every member of the Company undertakes to contribute to the assets of the Company, if the company is wound up while he or she is a member or is wound up within 1 year after the date on which he or she ceases to be a member, for-

- the payment of the debts and liabilities of the company contracted before he or she ceases to be a member, and the costs, charges and expenses of winding up: and
- the adjustment of the rights and contributions among themselves, such amount as may be required not exceeding €1.27.


